It has been a very challenging year operating the club with all of the restrictions in place by the Contra Costa County Public Health Department. Thanks to our members and the work of the Donation Mortgage Retirement Committee, we were able to catch up with the mortgage payments through the end of the year. The club needs to keep the effort going so we can reach our goal of paying off the mortgage. The last day to make a donation under the current program with membership dues credits and free rental incentives ends at midnight, December 31st.

I want to thank our members for their support and attending the dinners where many of them enjoyed the views off the outside patio. There are no other venues like you can see from our club with the boats and jet skis traversing the channel, docking the boats in front the club and watching an occasional cargo ship navigating to nearby ports. What makes the club so special is of course our members, who we think as part of a special yacht club family.

While the special donation program helps to keep our mortgage current, the membership dues will help provide operating funds. Please consider adding a contribution to the building fund, operating fund and Recreational Boaters of California (RBOC).

Be sure to follow the latest County Health Department orders on COVID-19 to see what facilities are open. The County Health Department closed indoor dining on November 17th. A set of canopies and heaters will provide cover over the patio to keep our members comfortable. We are planning the Lighted Boat Parade on December 12th and followed the next morning by the Sunday garlic egg breakfast. A special New Years dinner is being planned and having the celebration timed with New York time. A breakfast brunch will follow on New Year's Day to honor the in-coming Commodore.

While the impact of the COVID-19 continues to affect our operations, the 2021 board will plan a number of exciting events keeping in mind the safety and health of our members. Past events have included a Super Bowl party, chilli cook off, Saint Patrick's Day dinner, crab feed, opening day parade, casino night, luau with Hawaiian dancers, horse (or people) races, and hosting other yacht clubs for cruise-ins and cruise outs. To make these events a success, we will need your active participation once the county restrictions are lifted. Please consider volunteering especially as a chef to show off your culinary talents.

Since this is my last Yeoman article, I would like to thank our Yeoman editor, Monica Fraga and her able assistant, Katie Essayan. This year we got to know some of our members both new and long time members through the insightful interviews of Evie and Joe Dopart. You can continue to enjoy some of Joe's engaging interviews during one of the quarterly birthday/celebration celebrations. To maintain the production of the Yeoman, Judi Adcock has agreed to take over as the new editor. Please support Judi by getting your articles submitted in a timely manner.

I want to extend a big thank you to PICYA delegate Marilyn Sperling who was the person most responsible for earning five stars in the club of the year rankings. This is the first time we achieved this honor along with only two other yacht clubs this year. Marilyn and her husband, Richard helped the club earn COTY points by participating in the coastal cleanup and dock walker program, by promoting boat parades and by making donations for the wheel chair regatta and scholarship fund. The most points were earned when our members entered six model boats in the VIRTUAL opening of the bay parade.

Thank you for your support in the PYC elections. We have all agreed to volunteer time to the club. 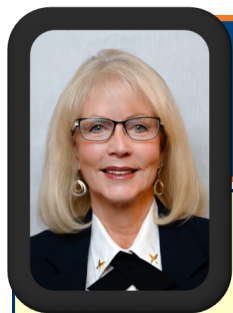

Joyce's grandfather was from Spain and was a Political disadent. He fled for their lives to the United States when they were asked to leave that country. They immigrated to Idaho and then to Vacaville, Ca. She had 2 brothers and 2 half-sisters. Joyce grew up in Concord and attended school in the Pine Hollow area of Concord. Joyce's dad was a paint salesman for Pittsburg Plate Glass Company. Her mom worked at hardware stores.

Dan and Joyce met at Clayton Valley High School. Dan's family moved to Fairfield. Dan used to hitchhike from Fairfield to Clayton each weekend to see that great looking girl named Joyce. Later on, he bought a motorcycle and drove down on that to see her. Dan was 21 years old when they married and Joyce was 19. They have been married 43 years.

They lived in Concord for the first 7 years. Their first house was in BayPoint. Then they bought their condo on Pelican Loop in Pittsburg in 2003. They have 3 beautiful Shetland Sheep Dogs named: Cassie, River and Brook.

Joyce has always worked in the Dental Field. She has done all the books and payroll for 40 years. Dan and Joyce own Hoffman Reptiles in Concord. It has all kinds of interesting reptiles like lizards, iguanas, crickets, frogs, turtles and much more. He also sells food and all kinds of supplies for the animals. Take a visit down there sometime. It is a very interesting place..

They have enjoyed many water activities together. They are avid water skiers doing Slalom and Barefoot for 30 years. They even had a special barefoot Ski Boat for 30 years. They also have a 25' Cruiser named Future Dinghy.

They were good friends with Vinny Cabalos at the Liberty Hotel. That is when Vinny invited them to sail every Thursday on Kenny McCauley's boat, a past member of PYC. They used to go on many sailboat races. Afterward they would end up visiting PYC in the evening. They enjoyed it so very much, they decided to join it.

Their newest enjoyment is a small motorhome. Although it is a small conversion, it has all kinds of comfortable amenities. They love traveling around and visiting all kinds of new places. Best of all, we enjoy having them at our club and are very happy they are our members.

Interview with Jay Lightner

Jay's Dad's side was from Kansas City, Missouri. They were Dorothy and James. Dorothy was a real western "Church Lady". Jay was fortunate enough to go to visit them every summer. His grandmother taught him how to cook. His grandfather worked at the airport.

His maternal side was from Puerto Rico. He used to visit his family there where he had a lot of cousins.

Jay was born and raised in Oakland. He has a half brother and sister. He was the baby in the family. They moved to Union City where he went to junior and some senior high school. Then they moved back to Oakland where he graduated from high school in 1985. He was very good at baseball and football. After high school he went to help run the family business.

Jay's family was into thoroughbred horse racing. Jay joined his dad in the business. The business was called Serendipity Staples. Serendipity Staples was very successful. They had as many as 20 horses in various stages of racing development. Jay named one of the horses after himself. It was called Jay Light. They traveled all over the Bay Area race tracks as well as those throughout the state. When Jay's dad died, he dissolved the business by auctioning of all the horses.

He bought a house in New York Landing in Pittsburg. He has a son he calls "Little Jay" who is now attending The University of Las Vegas in Nevada and majoring in Psychology and minoring in Business. He is very proud of his

son. He had a beautiful daughter Jaia, who tragically passed in a car accident. She was just 13 years old. RIP Jaia. He also was a foster parent for 17 years.

In 2000, Jay began a program called Lighthouse Mentoring Center for foster kids. He has one program in Pittsburg and 3 in Antioch. There are 2 homes for girls and 2 for boys. The program helps with high level kids, bi-polar kids, commercially sexually exploited teens and many more teens that need help. He has 40 staff members working for him. He trains and monitors the staff continuously. The programs are approved by the county and are funded by the state.

Jay also ran a Boys and Girls Basketball program at Central Junior High for 10 years. He also coached young boys football teams all the way to championships.

Jay needs more fund raisers. He recently ran one in Las Vegas and raised \$15,000 for the program. Donations are always welcome. He is also looking for volunteers that would like to be on the board as an active board member.

Jay joined Pittsburg Yacht Club about 10 years ago. He enjoys the camaraderie and also uses our club to have parties for his "kids". He has them get all dressed up and shows them a wonderful time.

He also belongs to a car club called The Show Stoppers. He has an Old School Pontiac GTO and a wide body suicide Dodge Charger. He even hosts a car show at the Antioch Fair Grounds.

In all, Jay is a very fun, busy person that loves the work he does. He loves to help mentor and inspire these young people to live a much better life than where they came from. He would appreciate any help he can get, from financial help, to hands on board help with these young people. Just listening to him tell about his programs, makes you excited about what a wonderful job it is to work with these young people. If you see him around the club, go talk to him about it.
