The pig was delicious a big thanks to Bill Champagne from Solano Yacht Club and all their members who cruised in. What a great club.





For those that may not know, the Legislature is currently between Sessions, with June 1st being the deadline for 2018 legislation to pass through the houses of origin. One issue of great interest to RBOC is the cleanup of abandoned Commercial Vessels in the Delta. AB 2441(Frazier) has passed through the Assembly and next proceeds to the Senate for consideration.

The bill would create the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Abandoned Vessel Removal

Account is in the General Fund and would require that the moneys in the account be available, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to fund the removal of abandoned and derelict Commercial Vessels from lands and Waterways—including tidelands and submerged lands within the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta.

RBOC has testified on this measure in the Legislature, expressing support for the concept of commercial interests being identified to financially support efforts to remove abandoned and derelict Vessels from the State's Waterways, also noting the organization's caution that the bill in its final form, not target recreational boaters to fund this important effort.

In its current form, AB 2441 would require that rental income from surface uses for lands in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta be used for the removal of abandoned and derelict Commercial Vessels from lands and Waterways, including tidelands and submerged lands within the Delta.

ARTICLE VI – OFFICERS

Section 2 {{{ partial changes } }}

In addition to the duties of the officers listed below, the aforementioned officers shall be responsible for complying with the duties and responsibilities provided in the latest version of the PYC "Duties and Responsibilities of Officers, Directors and Delegates. See Article XIII (Standing Rules) and shall review available guidance for their respective positions.

The Rear Commodore

- (1) The Rear Commodore shall assume the duties of the Vice Commodore in his/her absence.
- (2) Shall be in charge appoint a Chair for of 2 sub committees. The chairs will each select a committee of members to execute the functions as shown in the document called <u>Duties And Responsibilities</u>. maintaining the clubhouse including machinery, appliances, etc.
- (3) Shall coordinate with PYC Enterprise Inc to maintain all interior building set-ups, as appropriate for their functions.

Shall ¶

(4) Shall perform other duties as may be directed by the Commodore.

The Port Captain

- (1) Shall make all arrangements for incoming cruises and coordinate with the Rear Commodore as required.
- (2) Shall perform other duties as may be directed by the Commodore.





ARTICLE VII - MEETINGS

Section 1

General membership meetings shall be held on the evening of the second Friday of each month January, March, May, July, September, October and November. Should a meeting night fall on a holiday, that meeting will be held on the following Friday. However, the Board of Directors may elect to change the General Meeting time and/or day after announcing the change in the Yeoman and by posting in the club and or by first class mail, telephone, email and or PYC Facebook posting at least five (5) days in advance of such meeting. They may not change the meeting time and date more than three (3) times in a calendar year.

A quorum for a General Membership meeting shall consist of 10 percent of the voting Members in good standing.

General meetings may be postponed or canceled by a majority vote at any general meeting

Section 2

Special meetings may be called by the Commodore or upon the written and signed request of ten (10) Members. Notice will be given to the General Membership by either first class mail, posting in the club, e-mail, or and PYC Facebook posting, will be given five (5) days in advance of such special meeting. A quorum for these meetings shall consist of ten percent (10%) of voting Members in good standing. Meetings may be postponed or canceled by a majority vote at any regular meeting



Section 3

Board of Directors shall meet monthly. The schedule of monthly meetings of the Board shall be established at its first meeting in January. Additional meetings of the Board may be called by the Commodore when necessary. A quorum for a Board Meeting shall consist of 70 percent (70%) 9 of the Officers and Directors.

Section 4

The meetings of operation of the PYC are is governed by the Robert's Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XII -STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1

All annual standing committees shall be appointed by the incoming Commodore by November 30, to be in place at the January meeting with the approval of the Board of Directors. Committees shall report at least semiannually to the Membership. All committee Members must be Members in good standing.

- (1) Membership and Marketing Committee: Shall be composed of no tless fewer than five (5) Members including the Chair. The principal functions of this Committee shall be publicity and maintaining Membership.
- (2) House and Rules Committee: The principal functions of this Committee shall be to review and update all provisions for the day-to-day operations and maintain the proper rules of conduct for members and guests within the clubhouse, include the operations of the galley.
- (3) Bylaws Committee: Principal functions include reviewing the Bylaws and making recommendations for needed revisions and submitting changes that are submitted by the Members to the Board of Directors. The Chair of this Committee shall have served a minimum of one (1) year on the Committee.
- (4) Budget and Finance Committee: The Club Treasurer shall be a permanent Member of the committee. Principal functions shall include financial fact finding, to advise the Board on all matters relating to financing of the Club's administration, preparation of the annual budget for presentation to the Board of Directors and the Membership, and to review annually the cost of initiation fees and dues.
- (5) Building and Grounds Committee: Principal functions of this Committee will be the repair and maintenance of Club properties. The Chair shall maintain a petty eash fund.

- (6) Safety Committee:
- (5) Safety Committee: Principal functions shall be to promote and practice safe boating, to promote and practice safety on Club properties and to provide first aid training.
- (6) (7) Yeoman Committee: Principal function shall be the publication, content, printing and distribution of a monthly newsletter, the *Yeoman*.

Section 2

(7) Operational Procedures Committee: Audit Committee: Shall be composed of three (3) members, one of whom is currently serving as an Officer or Director of the Club and will be the Chair. The Commodore shall appoint the Audit Committee no later

than the November Board Meeting. The eligible members will be approved by the Board of Directors. A listing, of the Scope for Review, for the current year shall be submitted to the Board at the March Board meeting. The Audit Committee shall submit the proposed report on any procedural changes to the Board at the October meeting. Upon approval, the procedures shall be implemented into the appropriate documents, annual audit report no later than the first general meeting in July. A preliminary report shall be submitted to the Board no later than the April Board meeting.


