

When I wrote my article for the July Yeoman I expected the yacht club to be open for inside dining on July 1st. Due to the increase in cases of COVID-19 in Contra Costa County and, indeed the entire state, we needed to remain as outside dining only. We opened for outside dining June 13 following the rules for restaurants. Restaurants can only serve outside and can serve alcohol along with meals. No indoor service is permitted. Our bartenders worked out a plan to offer service to our members under the state guidance for restaurants. You must wear a facial covering at all times except when actively eating or drinking. You order your meal and drink from the outside bar window. You must wear a facial covering to order. The bartender receives your payment and prepares your drink. The meals are prepared in the galley and delivered to a table in a doorway for pick up. You may pick up a meal when you are ready – no rush. Once you have ordered a meal, you may order an additional drink, if you like. The bartenders try to keep the meal cost very reasonable. We are open Wednesday, Friday and Saturday from 5 pm to 9 pm. We are concerned for the safety of all of our members. We would not be open at all if it were not for the procedures adopted and refined by our bartenders. They meet the guidance for restaurant service developed by the state of California and confirmed by Contra Costa County Health. Our thanks to *Kandi*, *Shelly* and *Mark* for their dedication and hard work!

We did not have any major events at the club in June. Our sales in June covered our bar costs and made a contribution toward the club expenses. We are doing our best to reduce expenses, including shutting down most refrigeration and air conditioning. Thanks again to our volunteer bartenders working in challenging conditions!

Our deck is open! If you are healthy, grab your facial covering and come on down for a meal and a drink. Enjoy the breeze. Enjoy the sunset. Visit with old friends. We look forward to seeing you!



Interview with Gary McGrath

Gary McGrath and his lovely wife Estella (now deceased) have been a very important integral part of Pittsburg Yacht Club for many years. They have both been Commodores of PYC; Gary has been the Vice Commodore of our club 3 times. He holds the most prestigious position of any male member of our Yacht club ever had. He was the President of the International Order of the Blue Gavel of the Western Division of the United States. (further explanation at the end of the article).

Gary was born in Portland, Maine and lived there for the first 10 years of his life. He still has many relatives there where he acquired his love for fishing and boating. Even though he lived in many other states, he spent all his summers in Maine. Other states he lived in were Connecticut, Massachusetts, Missouri, Colorado and South Carolina. He has been in 38 states of our country.

He attended Aurora High School in Colorado and went on to the University of Colorado. He enjoyed music, playing the saxophone in the high school band, in a western band and briefly in a dance band. He worked as a car hop beginning at 13.

He joined the Navy active reserves in 1954 and was on active duty in 1959. He met his lovely wife Estella on Halloween Night. He belonged to a car club called "The Gamblers". He drove a 1951 customized maroon Lincoln Monterey that had dice hanging from the rear-view mirror. He would go cruising with 3 of his other friends. That night they hung out at Kelly's Place where he met Estella and the rest is history. Also, that evening as they were cruising another car full of guys pulled up alongside him and were looking for trouble. Gary pulled back and they pulled ahead of him. Then they turned around and shot his car 3 times. Once in his front head light, once in the back and once in the side. You could say "it was an unlucky car."

He married Estella in 1956. They honeymooned in South Park, Colorado. (yes, there is such a place). Then they traded in his Lincoln for a 1955 Mercury that was snowshoe white with a red hard top. Gary then went to work at Martin Murrieta doing quality control on Titan Missiles. He worked on the Titan 1, 2 and 3. While working he was finishing college at the same time. Another job he had was selling cash registers.

Estella and Gary were married 58 years. They had 4 sons. One lives in Atlanta, Georgia, one in Concord, one in Clayton and one at home with him. He has 5 grandchildren. They are all boys except for one girl which is the love of his life. He gets to see her quite often. He also has had special puppies that he enjoys very much. Concord has been his home for 37 years.

He first belonged to the Metropolitan Yacht Club in Jack London Square, Oakland, Ca. He rose to the position of Commodore there. While at the Club he bought a boat from someone who is a friend of his to this day: Ralph Tocci. Ralph used to have a boat business in Antioch but moved it over to Pittsburg. He then joined the Pittsburg Yacht Club and convinced Gary to move on over and become a member also which he and his wife did. His first boat was a 31"Trojan. He also has owned a 19"Keaton ski boat, a 34"Carver which was destroyed in a fire on P dock, and a 38"Chris Craft Constellation that sunk at the dock. Someone had disconnected the electrical cord from the dock to the boat.

Gary and Estella were very very active in Pittsburg Yacht Club and in the International Order of the Blue Gavel. This is the highest Yachting Organization in the United States & Hawaii. It is divided into 5 areas. Our area is known as Delta District 19 and is in the Western Division. It is an honor to belong to this organization. The local chapter consists of local past commodores. You have to be a member in good standing to be voted into this organization by The Past Commodores that are already in this. Gary was voted into this. Then he applied and was elected to be the Vice President of the Western Area of which we are part of. Next he applied and was elected to be the President. It takes at least 10 years of total dedication, involvement and hard work plus a lot of traveling to be the top person of the whole organization. Gary then rose to be the International President of the Blue Gavel. One of his most special places to go was to the Rose Parade in Portland, Oregon. That was a very special memory. We are very fortunate to have someone like him with his background and extensive knowledge in our club. Thank you, Gary, for putting Pittsburg Yacht Club in such a high position in the Yachting World. When you get a chance, go talk to Gary about some of his experiences. You will find them fascinating and very very interesting. We are indeed proud to have him as a distinguished member of Pittsburg Yacht Club.

BOATING SAFTEY BY ED STETSON

RECALL ALERT—More than 40 Million Kidde Fire Extinguishers. This Kidde Fire Extinguisher equipment recall

includes models supplied with boats and PWC from 1973 to 2017.

Editor's Note: We received the following media release from BoatUS on Nov. 6th regarding an important recall of Kidde fire extinguishers, many of which may be on boats. I used the information and discovered that each of the three Kidde extinguishers in my household are subject to this recall. We urge readers with Kidde extinguishers on their boat or in their home or shop to take action.

ANNAPOLIS, MD, November 6, 2017—More than 40 million Kidde fire extinguishers equipped with plastic handles, some on the market for more than 40 years, have been recalled. According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), "The fire extinguishers can become clogged or require excessive force to discharge and can fail to activate during a fire emergency. In addition, the nozzle can detach with enough force to pose an impact hazard." A recall for Kidde Fire Extinguishers has been issued for 134, ABC- or BC-rated models manufactured between January 1, 1973, and August 15, 2017.


CPSC says there have been approximately 391 reports of failed or limited activation or nozzle detachment, including one fatality; approximately 16 injuries, including smoke inhalation and minor burns; and approximately 91 reports of property damage.

The BoatUS Foundation for Boating Safety and Clean water is urging recreational boat owners to check their boats for the recalled extinguishers and get a free metal-handled replacement by going to the CPSC recall website.

The recall affects both plastic-handle and push-button Pindicator Kidde fire extinguishers, including 134, ABC- or BC-rated models manufactured between January 1, 1973, and August 15, 2017. The extinguishers are red, white or silver and were sold in the US and Canada through a wide range of retailers, from Montgomery Ward to Amazon. The CPSC recall website shows how to easily identify the affected extinguishers.

In the recall, <u>Kidde also acknowledged</u> the free replacement push-button extinguisher being sent to personal watercraft owners is similar in size to the recalled model but may not fit in the same location as the old fire extinguisher. "This may require a slightly different mounting orientation or location," said BoatUS Foundation Assistant Director of Boating Safety Ted Sensenbrenner.

Kidde may also be contacted toll-free at 855-271-0773 from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. ET Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. ET Saturday and Sunday. The company offers additional recall information online at kidde.com by selecting "Product Safety Recall."

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








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
