

Thanks to Judi Adcock, we held our second virtual meeting of the PYC Board. The meeting was held on May 6th and attended by nearly all of the Officers and Directors. Also attending the meeting beside board members were the chairpersons of the enterprises, bylaws, safety and house and rules committees.

The treasurer reported the taxes have been paid. The City of Pittsburg indicated they will be contacting the club to discuss our financial situation once the county public health department lifts the shelter-in-place order to open the club.

The PYC board approved the Nominating Committee consisting of Lynn Havens, chair and committee members Gary McGrath, Joe Dopart, George Converse and Adele Hicks Mirata. The committee will determine what vacant positions are needed to advertise in the July Yeoman.

The membership roster was updated on March 31st to include only those who have paid their dues. A current roster was needed to determine qualified candidates to fill positions for office. Margie Huff also volunteered to take over the 90 day membership.

The renewal quote of the insurance premium for both PYC and enterprises was provided by the insurer Hanover Insurance Company and approved by the PYC Board. The cost of the insurance premium for this coming year in June was lower by \$147 over the current year and will be paid in eleven monthly installments without any additional fees.

As a result of the Contra Costa County Public Health orders the Pittsburg Yacht Club has been closed since March 16th. The latest county public health orders required the extension of the shelter-in-place order through May 31, 2020. The order is complement to the stay-at-home order issued by Gov. Gavin Newsom which required people to stay at home except for doing essential activities. The governor developed four stages that will provide criteria to reopen businesses. Since the yacht club has an ABC Liquor License and county health permits, the club must follow steps to address restrictions under the State and county public health department. The governor indicated the state as a whole will advance from one stage to another while local jurisdictions will work on responsible reopening plans. Each county's public health department will advance through the stages at different rates with some progressing faster than others. Contra Costa County currently does not meet two of the six criteria on the Bay Area re-opening checklist. The number of people tested and contact tracking do not meet the criteria for our county, even the number of cases are flat or decreasing. Since we do not meet the reopening criteria, we are hoping we can obtain regulatory approval before the first events are held such as the birthday/anniversary party and welcome back dinner. Please check your emails and other club postings for updates.

To prepare for the re-opening of the yacht club, the PYC Board approved a set of temporary house rules to protect our members, bartenders, servers and cooks. Protective equipment is being purchased for nitrille gloves and sanitizer wipes. Diagrams were prepared for mapping physical spacing in the bar and dining areas. Plexiglass barriers will be erected by Shannon Davis to separate bar staff from customers at serving stations.

Deep cleaning of our bar area, galley and bathrooms were conducted. Special thanks for Jan Iaconis who led the cleaning effort. George Iaconis replaced a leaky faucet and repaired other connections needed behind the bar. The carpets were shampooed with funding by Mark Pavusko and Margo Miyamoto. Margo and Chris Brodsky hand scrubbed the carpet to eliminate the spots before the carpet was shampooed. The carpet never looked so good and will be ready to welcome back our members.

PYC HOUSE RULES COMMITTEE DRAFT Approved by PYC Board on _____ COVID-19 VIRUS PANDEMIC RULES

These PYC rules are temporary for the purpose of Covid-19 Virus Pandemic opening of restaurants dated May 12, 2020. These rules are effective until the current restrictions are modified by the Contra Costa Health Department and Governor Newsom to prevent the virus from spreading. These rules are supplemental and do not replace the prior House Rules approved by the Board of Directors on November 1, 2019.

1. Members will be required to comply with the six-feet distance in the dining room, bar area, and the deck area. Families can sit together if they reside in the same household.

2. The club will have sanitation wipes available by the door at the club entrance for attendees/members.

3. All members/guests need to wear face masks inside the club when they aren't eating and drinking.

4. The club may have to take temperatures of working volunteers at the club entry at all events. If anyone has a temperature of over 100 degree fahrenheit, the volunteer will be required to leave because they are considered to be ill and may infect other members.

5. The reservations will require only PYC members be allowed to attend events because there may be a limit on club members of 56 people who can attend.

6. A limited number of cruise-in members can attend events. PYC Club may be limited to 56 people and priority of PYC members will be exercised during this pandemic.

7. All food servers must wear face masks and rubber gloves while serving food.

8. All cooks must wear face masks and rubber gloves while preparing food.

9. Bartenders must collect money for meals and drinks behind the plastic shield for their own protection. Food will be served at the tables in the dining room.

10. When bartenders serve drinks on the dining room floor tables, they need to wear face masks and rubber gloves. This is also required if bartenders are picking-up glasses on the dining room floor.

11. Bar area is closed - PLEASE DO NOT SIT AT BAR AREA TABLES.

12. Members who set-up the club for meals and decorate the club are required to wear a face mask and rubber gloves while working. Utensils are to be pre-rolled in napkins before giving them to customers. Avoid use of shared condiments (salt/pepper shakers, ketchup, etc).




